GERMANY AND EUROPE AT ITS END

#### DEEPL TRANSLATION

States do not die in fire. They burn up inside - slowly, insidiously, unnoticed. It is not the external enemy that brings them down, but the slow disintegration of their inner backbone. And this is exactly what we can observe today - not only in distant crisis regions, but right in the centre of Europe. Here too, in our supposedly stable democracies, a process is taking place that has always had the same result in history: system collapse. Not through bombs. Not through invasion. But through self-poisoning.

I have seen many crisis regions. I have observed states before they collapsed. And I have learnt that there are patterns - early warning signs that are always the same. No country falls from one day to the next. It falls apart in stages. It first loses its orientation, then its confidence, then its ability to act - and finally its inner cohesion. And the first domino is almost always the same: the illusion of security.

A dangerous indifference has spread in the comfort zone of Western societies. The assumption that freedom, prosperity and stability are a matter of course has disarmed entire generations - both mentally and emotionally. While other countries plan their strategy over decades, we leave our future to daily journalism and a political class that is preoccupied with crisis management but has long since lost control. The population feels it - but it has no language for it. So they take refuge in consumption, distraction and virtual identities. The system is alive - but it is burning inside.

The mechanisms of this disintegration are manifold, but they are all interlinked. First, trust erodes - in politics, the judiciary, the media, in neighbours, institutions, even in the future itself. Then comes fragmentation. Society splits into groups, milieus and camps. Togetherness becomes the exception. People live next to each other, not with each other. Mistrust replaces solidarity. Anyone who thinks differently is fought against. Anyone who points out grievances is isolated. The social foundation is crumbling - quietly, but for good.

Then the state is overwhelmed. The systems that were once built to protect the population - police, administration, health, education - are collapsing under their own weight. Not through external attacks, but through internal overload, ideological self-deception and dysfunctional structures. The forces, the means, the will are lacking. The system becomes lethargic, helpless and merely administers. The citizen realises: I am on my own. And they begin to disengage - emotionally, morally, legally. The social contract is tacitly cancelled.

In this phase, the lie becomes visible: the system asserts its strength while it has long been tottering. It stages itself through PR, digital campaigns and moral language - but it no longer works. The reality outside, on the street, in the authorities, in everyday life, contradicts the slogans. The truth can no longer be suppressed - only anaesthetised. And anyone who speaks it is declared the enemy.

But the real enemy does not come from outside. It has long been inside. In the form of indifference, fear, self-censorship, corruption, abuse of power and cultural self-hatred. Societies that deny themselves are no longer able to defend themselves. States that are ashamed to draw borders - ideologically, culturally, physically - lose their backbone. And systems that no longer protect their own citizens lose their claim to loyalty. All it takes is a small trigger - a blackout, a financial crash, an external attack - and the house of cards falls.

The collapse in instalments is a dirty, quiet death. No heroic drama. Not a last stand. But a painful disintegration of everything that was once considered 'normal'. The roads are still passable. The shops are still open. Politicians are giving interviews. But inside, the system is already hollow.

And that's exactly where we are today. **Germany, Europe** - we are right in the middle of it. We are no longer experiencing cultural, political and social disintegration as a possibility, but as a reality. Day after day. Tangible. Visible. Unstoppable, if no countermeasures are taken. But no countermeasures are being taken - at least not with determination. Because the price would be truth. And we are not prepared for the truth.

I am not writing this out of anger. I'm writing it out of responsibility. Because I know how systems really collapse. And because I believe that we need people who not only consume, but recognise. People who no longer hope that 'those up there' will fix it, but who start to prepare themselves. Mentally. Physically. Strategically.

The collapse doesn't start with a bang. It starts with a yawn. With the sentence: 'Oh, it's not that bad after all.' And when this sentence becomes a mantra, it's often already too late.
